Adobe® Photoshop® Camera Raw 3.1 Read Me

Installation

This new version of the Camera Raw plug-in replaces the original Camera Raw plug-in that was installed with Photoshop CS2 and Photoshop Elements 3.0.

The Camera Raw 3.1 plug-in is not compatible with versions of Photoshop earlier than Photoshop CS2 or versions of Photoshop Elements earlier than Photoshop Elements 3.0.

- 1. Exit Photoshop Elements
- 2. Open My Computer
- 3. Double-click Local Disk (C:)
- 4. Navigate to Program Files\Adobe\Photoshop Elements 3.0\Plug-Ins\File Formats
- 5. Move the existing Camera Raw.8bi plug-in to another location (for example, a new folder on your desktop). Ensure you keep this version in case you need to revert back.
- Copy the Camera Raw plug-in, Camera Raw.8bi, from the download into the same folder as Step
- 7. Launch Photoshop Elements

Mac:

- 1. Exit Photoshop Elements
- 2. Open the Finder
- 3. Navigate to Applications/Adobe Photoshop Elements 3/Plug-Ins/File Formats
- 4. Move the existing plug-in to another location (for example, a new folder on your desktop). Ensure you keep this version in case you need to revert back.
- Copy the Camera Raw plug-in, Camera Raw, from the download into the same folder as in Step 3.
- 6. Launch Photoshop Elements

Photoshop CS2 and Adobe Creative Suite 2:

- 1. Exit Photoshop CS2.
- 2. Open My Computer.
- 3. Double-click Local Disk (C:).
- 4. Navigate to Program Files/Common Files/Adobe/Plug-Ins/CS2/File Formats.
- 5. Move the existing Camera Raw.8bi plug-in to another location (for example, a new folder on your desktop). Ensure you keep this version in case you need to revert back.
- Copy the Camera Raw plug-in, Camera Raw.8bi, from the download into the same folder as Step
- 7. Launch Photoshop CS2 or Adobe Bridge.

Mac:

- 1. Exit Photoshop CS2.
- 2. Open the Finder.
- 3. Navigate to Library\Application Support\Adobe\Plug-Ins\CS2\File Formats.
- 4. Move the existing plug-in to another location (for example, a new folder on your desktop). Ensure you keep this version in case you need to revert back.
- 5. Copy the Camera Raw plug-in, Camera Raw, from the download into the same folder as in Step
- 6. Launch Photoshop CS2 or Adobe Bridge.

Updates

- The highlight recovery algorithm now limits the amount of color estimated for near neutrals in overexposed image areas.
- Support for the "UserComment" EXIF tag has been added.
- The Export Settings command now only applies to the selected files.

New DNG Handling features (Photoshop CS2 software users only)

There are now two new preferences in the Camera Raw preferences dialog that control the handing of DNG files:

• "Ignore sidecar '.xmp' files":

When using the Photoshop CS2 software with DNG files, the Camera Raw plug-in conversion settings and other metadata is now stored directly inside the DNG files. Sidecar ".xmp" files are no longer required. To be compatible with settings and metadata applied to legacy DNG files created by Photoshop CS or Photoshop Elements 3.0, however, the Camera Raw plug-in by default looks for and applies settings and metadata stored in sidecar ".xmp" files.

This backward compatibility may be confusing if your workflow includes both DNG and non-DNG versions of a raw file in the same folder with the same base file name. It may become unclear which file the ".xmp" sidecar belongs to and the settings from the non-DNG file can mistakenly be applied to the DNG file.

Checking this option in the preference dialog disables this backward sidecar ".xmp" compatibility, and these sidecar files will be ignored when processing DNG files.

• "Update embedded JPEG previews":

In the Camera Raw 3.0 plug-in, updating the Camera Raw conversion settings stored inside DNG files does not update any embedded JPEG previews. Updating the preview significantly increases the processing time and is not required for the Photoshop CS2 and the Adobe Bridge workflows. Some other third party applications, however, make extensive use of the embedded previews.

To have the Camera Raw plug-in update the embedded previews whenever it updates the raw conversion settings, select this preference.

Another workflow option is leave this preference unchecked when fine tuning the raw conversion settings, then update all the embedded previews in the DNG files before handing the files off to the third party application. To enable this workflow, the Camera Raw 3.1 plug-in added this same option to update the embedded JPEG previews to the Export Settings command whenever one or more DNG files are selected.
