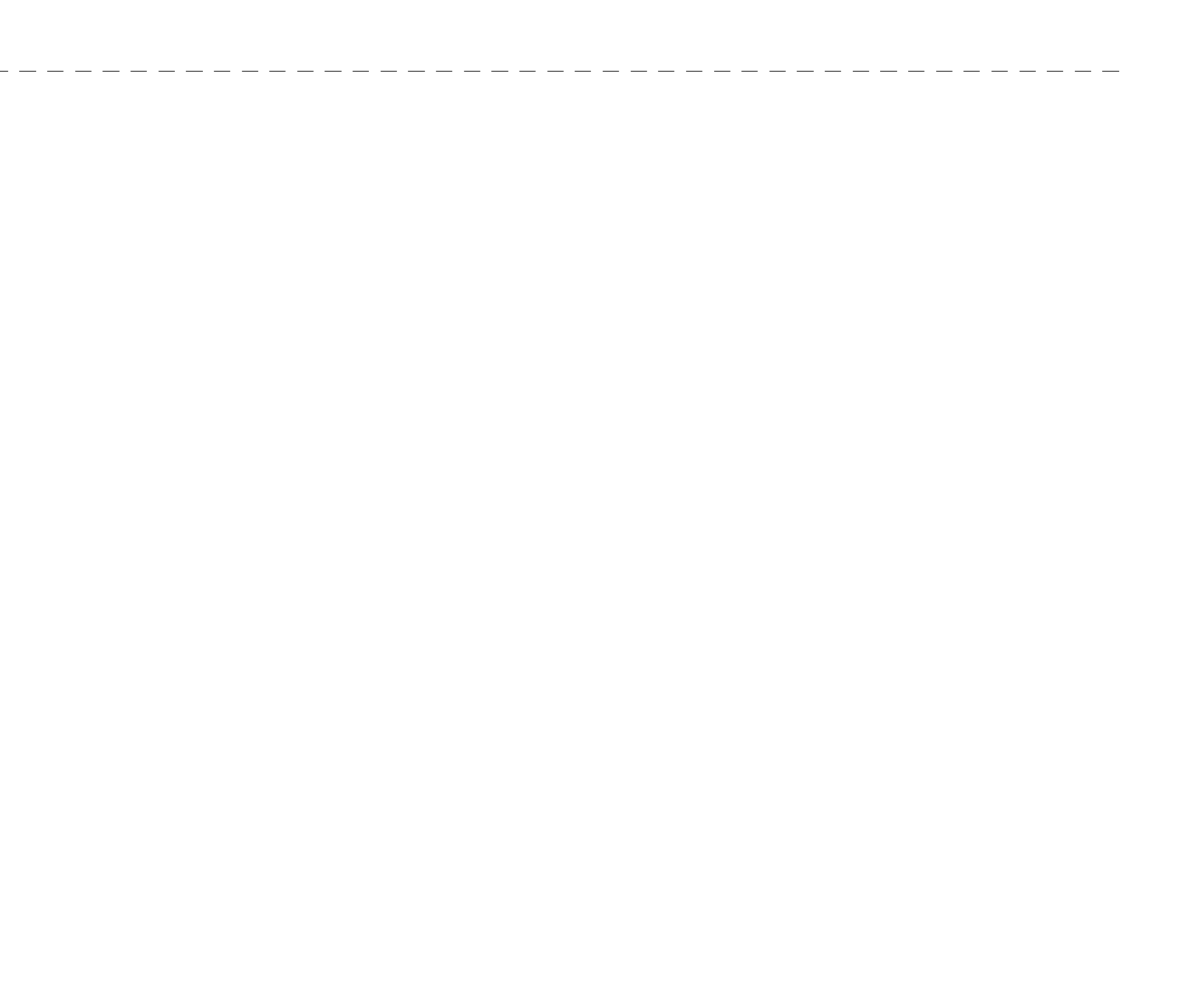

Transferring Calls

Transfer redirects a connected call. The **Transfer** key is the number to which you want to transfer the call.

- If on-hook transfer is enabled on the conference station, you can either hang up to complete the call, or press **Transfer**, and then hang up.
